The Joliet Diocesan March for Life Pilgrimage to D.C. was an adventure filled with abundant blessings.



Nearly 300 participants loaded 6 buses to journey to D.C. to advocate for life. We joined thousands for Mass at the National Prayer Vigil for Life at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception. Mother Mary, who

said yes to life, changed our lives forever. Standing in her Basilica, we knew we were safe in her mantle.

Two youth from the Diocese of Joliet, Amy and Erin, were asked to present the gifts to Cardinal Dolan! Amy offered the gifts on behalf of the Joliet Diocese, for each of you.

Cardinal Dolan's inspiring homily challenged all parishes to become welcoming sanctuaries. He shared a recent story about a fearful mother who kept her pregnancy a secret. She often visited a Catholic parish and immediately after the birth of her son, while his umbilical cord was still attached, left him in the parish manger. She knew he would be safe in God's hands. The baby was discovered and Cardinal Dolan proclaimed, "God bless Holy Child Jesus parish in Queens for radiating such a spirit of welcome, joy, warmth and outreach that this Mexican mother spontaneously knew her baby would be safe there. God bless this culture of life." He later gave the challenge, "Let all our people be like those parishioners whose smile and greeting and welcome and sense of love assured our young mom that her baby would be safe there." Are we the welcoming parishioners God calls us to be?

After a brief rest, Friday morning participants were off to the Youth Rally and Mass hosted by the Archdiocese of Washington. They prayed with groups from across the country, including those who traveled all the way from Texas. The priests from the Joliet Diocese concelebrated in these Masses, which was a time of heartfelt prayer for life.

Due to the inclement weather, they departed Washington moments before the storm. Although our pilgrimage didn't follow the itinerary that was planned, God worked in our hearts and through our time together. We received word that those who left a few hours after us were stranded on the road, so we joined in prayer for those who were caught in the storm.

God was with us each step of the journey. We thank you for your prayers and look forward seeing how we can continue to foster a culture of life now that we have returned.

Tim & Brendan McGowan Present Eagle Scout Projects at November, 2015 Council Meeting



Tim and Brendan McGowan, sons of Brother Knight Pat & Laura McGowan, Life Scouts from Boy Scout Troop 514, addressed the Knights at the November General Meeting to share information about their Eagle Projects. Tim was also the recipient of annual Council's \$1000 scholarship in 2015.

Brendan's project helped educate the community on the importance of water preservation by placing medallions on 200 storm drains throughout Warrenville. The project utilized 20 volunteers over two days. He discussed the importance of not dumping waste in the storm sewers to protect the waterways, as all drains lead to the river system. This project was in conjunction with Warrenville's Environmental Advisory Commission, which received a grant from SCARCE to obtain the medallions.

Tim's project was to create a permanent landscaping base for the temporary banners used by St. Irene ministries at the corner of Warren and Warrenville Roads. The base is comprised of a landscaping wall and low-maintenance perennial landscaping, improving the attractiveness of the corner for passersby. The project also included the purchase of two new removable poles/caps that can be removed from their cement bases when there is not a banner to display.

The boys both thanked the Knights for the sponsorship of Troop 514 over the years, which has allowed them the opportunity to grow through the scouting experience. The Knights voted to fund \$150 toward to complete Tim's fundraising for his project.
