

# Pro-Life Events Knights of Columbus Offers Lifeline to Persecuted Christians

During his annual report, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson called attention to the Knights of Columbus' efforts in assisting Christians facing persecution especially those facing genocide in the Middle East. He called this work the Order's greatest endeavor during the past fraternal year.

"In Iraq, Sytia and neighboring countries, Christians and other religious minorities are facing extinction," Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said. "Many receive no support from their governments or from the United Nations. They have had to rely on their fellow Christians, and they have been able to rely on the Knights of Columbus. Since 2014, we have raised more than \$11 million for Christian refugees. And that money has been a lifeline."

The contributions raised by the Knights have provided:

- \$800,000 worth of food for 13,500 families in Erbil, Iraq
- Medical clinics and long-term housing projects
- Support to exiled Syriac Catholic priests
- Catechetical classes for Syriac and Chaldean Catholics
- Assistance to besieged Christians of Aleppo, Syria
- Support of educational initiatives for refugees in Jordan
- Support of a variety of programs in Lebanon

"These efforts depend upon the active involvement of our brother Knights," he continued. "Some have donated to our Christian Refugee Relief Fund. Others have responded by participating in our Solidarity Cross program through our councils, which have sold more than 82,000 olive wood crossed made by Christians in the Holy Land."

Along with contributing vital financial assistance, the Knights of Columbus also conducted an enormous amount of research to compile a nearly 300-page report that documented conclusively the attacks perpetrated by ISIS against Christians. These efforts helped lead the U.S. government to officially declare these attacks on Middle Eastern Christians and other religious minorities as genocide. The Knights also conducted a powerful public awareness campaign to support this effort.

"My brother Knights, we made history!" the supreme knight said, commenting on the Order's effort to awaken the government to the Christians' horrific situation. "But," he continued, "this declaration is only the beginning. We will continue to work to ensure that the Christians who still speak the language of Jesus, and whose ancestors baptized St. Paul survive."

# World Youth Day Report PGK Mark Spiotta

Enclosed is a letter that I sent to **GK Tom Perez** at the conclusion of World Youth Days in Kraków this summer. I think it's important for our Brother Knights to understand how their support goes beyond the local community and indeed reaches out across the world. (Mark has been stationed by his company, Nokia, in Krakow, Poland for the last two years.)

#### **Worthy Grand Knight (Tom Perez)**

As World Youth Day (Światowy Dzień Młodzieży) here in Kraków just concluded today, I thought it would be worthwhile to offer a first-hand perspective of how the Knights of Columbus played a major role in enabling a very successful pilgrimage for nearly two million young and not-so-young adults.

I had the privilege of being one of hundreds of Knights who participated in WYD on-site, with the majority of Knights from throughout Poland. As an FYI, the Rycerze Kolumba (KofC) is celebrating its 10th year in Poland with over 4000 members so far. We also had a contingent of College Knights as they called themselves, truly young adults who were energized in both their faith and in the spirit of service.

The Knights of Columbus, along with the Sisters of Life (NY-based), sponsored the "Mercy Center" at Tauron Arena for English-speaking pilgrims. Mercy Center offered daily masses, a wide variety of catechesis sessions, wonderful performers and renowned speakers, Eucharistic Adoration, as well as relics of five Polish Saints for veneration and prayers of intercession:

- St. Faustina Kowalska, "Ambassador of Mercy," to whom Jesus revealed his merciful plan and Divine Mercy
- St. Maximillian Kolbe, martyred in Auschwitz to save the life of a stranger
- St. Albert Chmielowski, "Servant of the Poor"
- Blessed Jerzy Popiełuszko, martyred in 1984 by the communist security service for his support of Solidarity and basic human rights
- St. John Paul II, who needs no introduction

The Knights basically ran the entire Mercy Center, from security (including working with local police and state security) to one-on-one with pilgrims. Some of the tasks that we performed included greeting pilgrims, providing help and direction, guarding the Blessed Sacrament and relics, directing and helping the large number of cardinals, bishops, and clergy as they arrived, crowd control, and ushering daily mass for 20,000 pilgrims. Daily mass was both beautiful and an example of a well-orchestrated event. Typically there were perhaps 5 cardinals, 40 bishops, and another 150 priests. For communion, we had roughly 160 Eucharistic Ministers (clergy) who efficiently distributed communion to all present in

less than 15 minutes! Our own Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop William Lori, served as both a speaker and mass celebrant.

In addition, the Knights handled the lighting, sound, and video production for not just the Mercy Center, but several other major venues where up to 2 million pilgrims were in attendance.

And the highlight of the week was orchestrating a closing event where Pope Francis visited to meet the ~20,000 volunteers who helped with World Youth Day. While Pope Francis didn't arrive until 5pm, our work started around 9am to get ready for his arrival.

I received many compliments from all levels of clergy about the Knights and their support, in particular how they didn't need to worry about how an event would proceed because they knew that the Knights had it under control. This of course if typical of the Knights, whether it's a parish activity, a community event, or Mercy Center.

Enclosed are a few pictures that I took. Afterwards, I realized that I actually had very few since there wasn't really much time away from our official duties.

If you could perhaps pass this on to the council, I think it's important for them to realize how essential their work as Knights of Columbus brothers is to the Universal Church. Whether you were physically present in Kraków this past week or not, believe me – you helped!


