CDC: US abortion rate falls to lowest level in decades

The number and rate of abortions tallied by federal authorities have fallen to their lowest level in decades, according to newly released data. The latest annual report by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, incorporating data from 47 states, said the abortion rate for 2013 was 12.5 abortions per 1,000 women aged 15-44 years. That is down 5 percent from 2012, and is half the rate of 25 recorded in 1980.

The last time the CDC recorded a lower abortion rate was in 1971, two years before the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision that established a nationwide right for women to have abortions. Abortion was legal in some states at that time.


The CDC tallied 664,435 abortions in 2013 from the 47 states, down 5 percent from 2012 and down 20 percent from 2004. The CDC does not receive abortion data from California, Maryland and New Hampshire — and thus its total is less than the widely accepted current estimate of more than 900,000 abortions per year in all 50 states.

Back in 1990, when California was supplying data, the CDC recorded a peak of more than 1.4 million abortions. The CDC's latest findings meshed with an Associated Press state-by-state survey conducted last year — with extensive data from 2014 — showing that abortions had been declining in virtually every state since 2010. There were big declines in conservative states passing laws to restrict abortions and also in more liberal states that protected abortion rights.

The CDC report suggests there are several factors behind the abortion decline, including a sharp drop in adolescent pregnancies, expanded coverage of contraception costs by health care plans, and increased use of effective, long-lasting contraceptive methods such as intrauterine devices and hormonal implants.

Did You Know? Who is Sante Claus?

St. Nicholas, the origin of our Santa Claus, is believed to have been born in 280 in what is present-day Turkey. He was a bishop known as a protector of

children and sailors. He died on Dec. 6, 343 and is entombed in the port city of Bari, Italy. By the 1500s he was regarded as the most popular saint in Europe.

The Vikings set up a cathedral to him in Greenland. On Dec. 6, 1492, Columbus founded St. Nicholas, a port in Haiti.

The Netherlands celebrated him as Sinterklaas, and Dutch settlers brought his tradition to New York. The Sons of St. Nicholas was set up in New York City in 1773 as a counterpoint to the British societies Sons of St. George. Then in 1804 the New York Historical Society distributed images showing him in a blue tricorn hat, red coat and yellow stockings. Five years later, author Washington Irving wrote about him as the patron saint of NYC.

In 1821 a "Children's Friend" was the first illustrated book in the U.S. to depict Sante Claus (their spelling) in a sleigh with flying reindeer. This was also the first time he was shown coming on Christmas Eve instead of Dec. 6. The next year, the book's publisher friend and neighbor, Clement Clarke Moore, an Episcopal minister, wrote "An Account of a Visit from St. Nicholas" for his children.

In 1841 a Philadelphia store featured Santa Claus in a Christmas ad. Forty years later Thomas Nast, drew a Santa cartoon, with Mrs. Claus, elves and their North Pole workshop for "Harper's Weekly." By the 1890s the Salvation Army had introduced a Santa ringing a bell to collect for the poor.

Different countries use different names for parts of the Santa story. In Belgium Sinterklaas arrives by Dec. 6 on a boat, accompanied by his assistant Zwarte Pieten. (There were protests this year over the "Black Peter" image.) In Germany and Switzerland Christkind/Kris Kringle is the Christ child who brings gifts, often with Sinterklaas. France has Pere Noel and in England, Father Christmas. Scandinavian countries have a Jultomton, a goat pulling a sleigh. In Italy, La Befana, a good witch, puts gifts in stockings. And in Russia, Babouschka leaves gifts on Jan. 5, as atonement for misdirecting the Magi so Baby Jesus received nothing; her hope is that one stocking she fills will be for Christ.



Early-Bird Drawings: Drawings will be held Jan. 22 & 29 at St. Irene's Activities Center following the 11:00 AM Mass on these days. Each entry can only win once during the early-bird drawings, but remains eligible for the drawings on Super Bowl Sunday, Feb. 5, 2017.

Raffle on Super Bowl Sunday: Prior to the start of the football game, for each respective pool 100 number pairs will be randomly assigned to each raffle ticket holder, from (0,0) through (9,9). During the football game, one cash prize will be awarded to the person holding the winning number pair each time a team scores; a touchdown plus points after constitutes one score. The winning number pair is comprised as follows: the least significant digit (right most digit) in the NFC team score constitutes the first number, and the least significant digit of the AFC team constitutes the second number in the pair. The cash prize amount is determined by a random drawing from the available cash prize pool. The remainder, if any, at the game's end will be awarded by random drawing of those raffle tickets not having a winning combination during the football game.

The pool of 17 cash prizes are based on 100 tickets sold for each pool.
