Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish



Did You Know? Discrimination—A Long History Knights of Columbus Origins

To paraphrase an old ad slogan,: We've come a long way, baby! Or have we?

My mother's parents moved to Glen Ellyn in the 1920s. My mother told my brother and me stories of being chased by kids calling her a "dirty catlicker"(for "Catholic"). I remember when I was a child growing up in Glen Ellyn there were housing covenants that prevented Jews and African-Americans from living in the village. And when I went to college (which admittedly is about the time the earth was formed), there were many fine private universities that had a Catholic quota and even at the U. of I. sororities and fraternities had Catholic quotas.

Our country has a sorry history of discrimination on the basis of race, religion and/or ethnicity. Slavery, of course, is American's original sin, with its companion sin that blacks are only 3/5 humans. In the 1840-1850s the Know-Nothing party was formed as an anti-Catholic group. As soon as Irish or Italian or Hispanic people began arriving here in significant numbers, anti-Catholic/anti-immigrant sentiment reared its ugly head. The KKK reacted with violence against blacks, Jews and Catholics. Now it is anti-Muslim feeling.

John F. Kennedy had to reassure the nation that his Catholic religion would not interfere with or override his Constitutional obligations if he were elected president.

Fr. McGivney formed the Knights of Columbus as an amelioration of the anti-Catholic laws and practices.

I asked the question of whether we have come a long way. For every sign that some people feel comfortable discriminating against a particular religion, there have been massive rallies by citizens of every age, ethnicity, race or religion recently saying with a loud voice: That's not who we are!

After all, when one of us is diminished, we all are diminished.

And now you know!

FUN FACT: According to German folklore, the groundhog —although originally it was a bear or a badger — comes out of hibernation on Candlemas Day. (The French celebrate Jour de la Marmotte.) Our "celebration" started in 1841 in Pennsylvania. Sunny weather sends him back for six more weeks of sleep and winter; overcast means spring comes in six weeks. Both WI's Jimmy the Groundhog and MO's Huffy the Hog saw their shadows in 2017.
