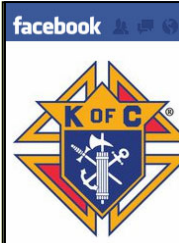
The LOC & CCW provided a basket "Raining Money" to the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart for their annual dinner dance.

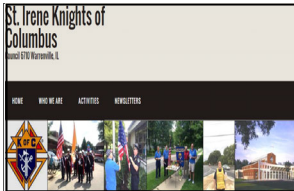

Did You Know? Good? Bad Friday?

Maybe I am showing my age, but I remember when most businesses closed either all day or for three hours on Good Friday. That got me wondering about other aspects of Good Friday.

For example, what is so “good” about it? We are commemorating a horrific death, after all. The good part, in simplistic terms of course, is that this was necessary to save all of us. (I recommend Justin Holcomb’s “What’s So Good about Good Friday,” on Christianity.com for a fuller explanation.)

“Good,” in its etymology, variously can mean holy or pious. Some scholars believe “Good Friday” is a corruption of “God’s Friday.” In Germany, though, the day is Karfreitag, Sorrowful or Mournful Friday. It has also been known as Stiller (Silent) Freitag or Hoher (Holy) Freitag.

In several Christian countries and in 12 U.S. states and 3 territories Good Friday is a public holiday.

Many solemn — and some not-so-solemn — rituals attach to Good Friday. We venerate the cross at the Good Friday service. Stations of the Cross are also traditional. In some Hispanic communities and along Jerusalem’s Via Dolorosa very moving pageants reenact Good Friday. In Polish churches parishioners spend that Friday night mourning by the Tomb. Some sects have special vespers.

An old wives’ tale says Good Friday is the day to plant seeds. Finally, that is the day to eat hot cross buns, a custom which dates to 1361 AD, when the Benedictine monks of England’s St. Alban’s Abbey, first made them to feed the poor.

Whatever the tradition or method of celebrating, we need to remember that Good Friday is necessary for Easter to exist.

- **Oil bearers:** 3 people are needed to carry in the holy oils. Rehearsal required on Tuesday, April 11th at 7PM.
- **Candle bearers:** 4 people are needed to carry candles for the enthronement of the holy oils. Rehearsal required on Tuesday, April 11th at 7PM.
