Grand Knight's Corner

A week ago, **Dave Schar** and I set off to Springfield, IL to attend the annual Illinois KofC State Convention. This trip marked Dave's first time attending the convention, while it was my 4th time attending in as many years. I wanted to take the opportunity to share what goes on

at convention for those who are unfamiliar. Convention is an opportunity for Knights across the state to meet to celebrate the accomplishments of our order, as well as council and individual successes. There is ample opportunity for fellowship, both at official convention events, and at the popular hospitality suites (our Joliet Chapter hosted one of the larger suites).

Saturday's sessions included remarks from our state officers and the Illinois State Chaplain Bishop Joseph Segal, handing out awards for Programs of the Year, Knight of the Year and Family of the Year, insurance awards, and the installation of the new state Squires officers. We also heard from former Supreme Deputy Grand Knight Logan Ludwig on some coming changes to earning Star Council, changes to the Ceremonials and the roll-out of an e-membership program. In the afternoon, the chapters meet in caucus to vote on members to represent the chapter at the Supreme Convention (held in St. Louis this year). There is then a beautiful mass held at the Cathedral, followed by a formal State Deputy Banquet. The banquet included additional remarks from Bishop Segal on the challenges of living authentically Catholic in an ever-secular and anti-Christian world, as well as a presentation of a \$100,000 check to the CEO of Special Olympics Illinois. There was also a heartfelt message from a Special Olympics Global Messenger, who shared his experiences of how he persevered beyond his disabilities to become a gold-medal long distance runner. The most memorable part of the evening was the State Deputy handing out his State Medallions, where our own PGK Wayne Decker was awarded a medallion for his many years of selfless work for the order. You've never seen Wayne smile wider.

On Sunday, the delegates come together for an official meeting to vote on various resolutions and to elect our new state officers. Among the many resolutions was one to honor the recipients of various chapter-wide honors, including our own **PGK Glen Kussman** as a recipient of the Victor Cardosi award. This portion of the convention can also be a bit trying, as roll-call alone can last nearly 30 minutes, while the nomination and election of officers, most of whom run un-opposed, can last well over an hour.

I hope this gives you a little insight into what goes on a State Convention. Overall, though it is a long weekend, it is a very worthwhile event that highlights the impressive accomplishments of our Order and leaves the attendees inspired to go back to their home councils and work harder to further our wonderful work.

Special Camps at Whites Pines Ranch June 4 &

Our Council has provided assistance each year to Special Camps, directed by Collen McDonald and founded by PGK Reed Callahan. "Special Camps provides opportunities for children and adults with intellectual disabilities to experience new activities, form friendships, increase independence and self esteem in 2 week long, loving, all volunteer run summer camps."

Teen Volunteers are Needed! Your help is needed finding the most outstanding teenage boys, high school college age, you know! We need 6 more boys who are responsible, have good social skills, and like to have fun. We need them to serve as camp counselors playing and coaching their campers with an intellectual disability, Down's syndrome or autism.

Activities include: horseback riding, swimming, archery, basketball, talent shows, learning to groom and paint our horses, volleyball, wood working, crafts, and finding pirate's treasure. Nightly parties include big bands, hayrides, campfire songs with s'mores around the bonfire, game night and performing in a parade. Our counselors call these the best parties ever!

It's completely FREE and you earn 100 community service hours. It also looks great on resume's and college admissions. Special Camps is a 100% volunteer run camp, endorsed by the Knights of Columbus.

What's the catch? We want you to do these activities beside a friend or two with intellectual disabilities, autism or Down's syndrome. Befriend someone in need of a buddy for the week, coaching them in the activities while participating yourself. We have adults who lead all of the activities, will be nearby for help if you need it, and dispense medications to you and your campers as needed.

Our campers are the most amazing group of people. Most are completely independent in taking care of their own needs, showering, dressing, brushing their teeth... they simply need reminders when it's time to start these activities and help sometimes finding their stuff. We have many campers who are amazing athletes, gifted singers, swimmers and rappers. Their talents will astound you! Our returning counselors (everyone wants to return), call this a "Life Changing" experience. They come to serve their campers, and leave having learned a lot from the campers they came to serve.
