Grand Knight's Corner

It's been a very emotional time for me these past couple weeks. On May 24 I learned of the death of a mom of one of my daughter's preschool classmates. She was only in her 30's and left behind a husband and two young sons. Thinking about how her two boys could possibly even attempt to grasp the loss of their

mom brought me deep grief. I saw the boys at a birthday party later that week and couldn't help but walk up to them and say hi, giving them a pat on the head, wanting so much to pick them up and give them a hug. The next day, I was honored to present our Council's Scholarship at the St. Irene 8th Grade Graduation. The scholarship was presented in honor of Rocky Phelps, who passed away a little over a year ago. Rocky's son Ben was actually in preschool with my oldest daughter Claire. Rocky's death affected me deeply, and I became very emotional as I spoke of him at graduation, especially in the presence of his wife Marcia and Ben. I then came back to work after a beautiful Memorial Day weekend to learn of the untimely death of one of my clients, who passed away from a heart attack while celebrating the holiday with his family. And now, just today, we learned of the loss of our dear Brother Knight Bob

Upon learning of Bob's passing I had to walk to a quieter side of my office, and just sat with my head in my hands for several minutes. Anyone who knew Bob knew what an emotional person he was, never afraid to shed a tear when offering a petition for those in his life who were ill or who had passed. Recounting how deeply Bob was affected by the struggles and losses of others amplified my own emotions when thinking of his passing. Bob's passing his a great loss to our Council and the St. Irene's community.

Bob became a Knight in 2004, and has been an active member ever since, serving as our Council's Youth Director for the past several years. Bob loved working with the youth of our parish and school, coordinating events such as the annual Free Throw contest, Spelling bee, Share our Soles shoe drive and Keep Christ in Christmas Poster contest. Bob will be remembered for his empathetic heart and his service to his community, but most of all for his devotion to his family, especially his beloved wife Mary.

In spite of all of this sadness and our grief, I am comforted by our heavenly Father's promise of Salvation. We must remember that our time on earth, even when one lives to an old age, is but a blink of an eye compared to the eternal reward that awaits us. Let us pray that we remain ever faithful to this promise and to God's plan for our lives.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

DID YOU KNOW? Father's Day, June 18



We take time on Sun., June 18, to recognize our biological, adopted, spiritual and honorary fathers...hopefully not with a new tie.

According to some sources, Fathers' Day started in 1908 in WV to honor men killed in a horrific coal mine accident. The more generally-accepted version is that it was started on June 19, 1910, (one year after Mothers' Day began) in Spokane, WA, by a daughter whose father was a single parent who raised his six children after his wife died in childbirth.

In 1913 Pres. Calvin Coolidge designated the third Sunday in June as Fathers' Day. In 1966 Pres. Johnson, through executive order, set the date in federal law, although it did not become an official <u>national</u> holiday until 1972.

Brother Knights will be handing out finger rosaries to all Fathers after the Masses at St. Irene Church on Father's Day.

Fathers' Day is now celebrated, on various dates, around the world, from Argentina to Zimbabwe. Mainly in Europe and Latin America, Fathers' Day is celebrated on Mar. 19, St. Joseph's Day.

This day, as is every day, is an appropriate time to thank Our Father, Lord of us all.
