DID YOU KNOW? Assumption of Mary August 15

On Nov. 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, under the doctrine of papal infallibility, established as dogma – meaning that you must believe it as an article of faith – that the Virgin Mary, "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into

heavenly glory." What is not dogma, though, is whether she was dead or alive at the time of being assumed. And certainly both traditions exist, whether we call it the Assumption of Mary or the Falling Asleep of the Blessed Virgin Mary (the Domition). The fact of assumption itself, however, has been around since the 200-300s.

St. Gregory of Tours, Bishop and historian of the Church, was the first to assert Mary's bodily assumption into heaven.

What also is up in the air (no pun intended) is where she was buried and then assumed up. Some early authorities say that it was in Ephesus, her traditional home, others maintain it was in Jerusalem. In an interesting parallel to the discovery of the tomb of Jesus, some theories claim the apostle Thomas (the Doubter), who was not present at her death as were the other apostles, asked to have the tomb reopened on the third day after her death and burial. It was then discovered her body was not there, only clothes, so they concluded that she had been brought to heaven by her Son. Unlike the Ascension of Jesus, who could rise of his power, Mary needed to be guided by angels or clouds or some outside agency.

The tomb of Mary became a pilgrimage site, now occupied by the Benedictine Abbey of the Domition of Mary.

Both Latin and Eastern Rite Catholics generally celebrate this feast on August 15; in the Eastern Rite it is preceded by a 15-day fast. The feast is a national public holiday in countries from Andorra to Vanuatu, and is combined with Mother's Day in Costa Rica and some parts of Belgium. In Canada, the Acadian population, where Mary is their patron saint, celebrates Fete Nationale. In many German-speaking countries Aug. 15 is also the Blessing of the Herbs; Mary is closely associated with herbs, as Scripture attests.

So say an extra rosary on her feast, and remember that her Assumption guides us to the hope and belief that we, too, will be taken to heaven at our death.
