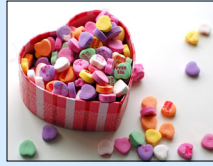

## DID YOU KNOW? Sweets or Sweet Sacrifice?



On Feb. 14 this year, an important holyday – Ash Wednesday – and an important “holiday” – Valentine’s Day – converge. For the sake of our soul, we are mandated on



Ash Wed. to fast, abstain and begin a season of sacrifice and service. If you are married or in an important relationship, you are probably “mandated” to celebrate and pamper your wife or dating partner. (By the way, nothing wrong with your wife pampering you on Valentine’s Day!)

The Sunday Parish Bulletin outlines your obligations on Ash Wednesday and through the Lenten season. But there is no firm guideline for Valentine’s Day. Ignore the day, however, at your peril: It is a mine-field, fraught with traps and potential missteps – all of which you will hear about (Trust me!) if you mess up.

I offer some suggestions on staying on the right path as someone who informed Jim when we were dating that Valentine’s Day stands as a national holiday that absolutely, positively, no-doubt-about-it, must be observed as such. Forewarning is fair knowledge. That said, as firecrackers, parades and cook-outs speak to the 4th-of-July, there are traditional ways to celebrate Valentine’s Day: candy or flowers or dinner out at a nice restaurant.

But you can be more imaginative, plus save money, in ways that still work with Ash Wednesday. Flowers are nice, but frankly more meaningful on days other than Valentine’s Day or a birthday or an anniversary. Candy is out on Ash Wednesday, as is a big restaurant meal.

How about: planning, shopping for, cooking and cleaning up after dinner once a week during Lent; doing the laundry; rubbing her feet; a nightly shoulder rub; long walks together; putting the cell phone down and actually talking with/listening to each other; eating healthier: small meatless meals are not just for Ash Wednesday and Fridays during Lent. I am certain you can come up with more suggestions that marry the sacrifice and service of Ash Wednesday and Lent to the observation of Valentine’s Day.

Have a transformative Lent and a Happy Valentine’s Day!

## Program Awards for December 2017

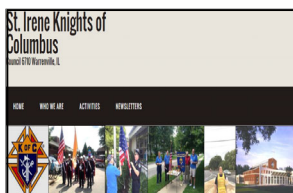
