Grand Knight's Corner

Happy Easter! The long 40 days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving are now behind us, and we can now dwell in the splendor of our risen Lord! I was able to get away from work and a never-ending pile of tax returns to spend Friday evening at a

beautiful Good Friday service with my family. While praying and contemplating the sacrifice Jesus made for us in his crucifixion, I thought about the great physical trials Jesus had to endure. It is easy to think of the death of Jesus in metaphysical ways, but films such as Mel Gibson's The Passion of the Christ help us to understand the physical agony our Lord's suffering. Meditating on his immense suffering, and knowing it was not for His sins, but for our own, caused me to look at the difficulties I face in my life in a much different light. Whether it's our financial constraints, problems at work, my struggle with weight loss, or frankly even just the pain I felt kneeling at church, those all felt so trivial when placed next to the suffering of Jesus.

During the Good Friday service there was Veneration of the Cross, where the clergy and congregation came to the front of the altar to offer a gesture of respect to the cross. Some simply bowed in front of cross, others touched it while many chose to kneel and kiss the wood of the cross. One of my daughters became upset, not wanting to go up with everyone looking at her. My wife and I calmed her, saying she just needed to walk up with us but didn't need to do anything. It was the best way to handle the situation with an 8 year old with causing too much of a stir. But what I really wanted to do was grab her by the shoulders and say, "Jesus was nailed to the cross and died for us! He endured unthinkable pain, and did it all for our sins! All you need to do in return is give the cross a simple touch. Is that too much to ask?" Again, being that she's only eight, this line of reasoning would not have been overly compelling, but it did give me pause to reflect on my own apprehensions in more publicly praising and spreading the Good News of our Lord. I pray that we as Knights find more ways to not only serve the Lord through our good works, but also find ways to spread his message of love and brings others to know Him better.

May this Easter season bring you and your family much peace and joy.

Knights of Columbus Sets Insurance Record for 17th Consecutive Year \$8.78 billion in new insurance sold 2/28/2018

The Knights of Columbus recorded its 17th consecutive year of growth in insurance sales in 2017 with \$8.78 billion in new life insurance sold — an increase of more than \$245 million over the previous year.
