Pro-Life My Pro-Life Trip to the State Capitol Adele Dunn, St John the Baptist, Winfield

Recently, I went on a pro-life bus trip sponsored by the Diocese of Joliet in early April. We were going to Springfield to meet our representatives to lobby for their veto of recently proposed extreme abortion bills. While I knew in my heart these bills were wrong, I didn't feel confident putting my objections into words, much less to a state official. Further details indicated that the diocese would provide handouts and brief us on the bills. I knew the Holy Spirit would have to take over here. To say I was uncomfortable with the situation is an understatement. One thing that bolstered my confidence, however, was having just seen the movie, Unplanned, the previous weekend. Being a visual person, the movie was just what I needed to back up my convictions.

As a young girl in the early 60's, I was about nine years old when I learned the definition of abortion. My father went "deaf and dumb" when I asked him for the meaning of the word abortion, the subject of a radio program playing in the background. From his reaction (or non-reaction), I knew this was a big deal, so later I found a dictionary and looked up the word. While the definition didn't give details, I understood enough of the meaning to know it was wrong. It wasn't until about a year ago after reading the book, Gosnell: The Untold Story of America's Most Prolific Serial Killer, and watching a YouTube video of witness testimony by Dr Anthony Levatino, a former abortion doctor, that I understood the details of an abortion. I don't think that I'm unique in not having questioned the details — my guess is that many pro-choice people are also ignorant of the facts.

So, I found myself "alone" on a bus full of people heading to Springfield. Because of my uncomfortableness, I busied myself by researching the details of the bills and the voting records of my legislators — still not sure any of these words would penetrate. As I sat there absorbed in self-doubt, I received a text message from my son-in-law thanking me for making the trip. I texted back that I was afraid I'd break into tears as I spoke to my senator. He replied, "Emotion is good. You can never have too much emotion." Apparently, he remembered my husband expressing that sentiment. I felt a little less fearful. The day began to brighten, and a deacon suggested the bus pray a pro-life rosary together. I took a turn, with a shaky voice, a led the group in the familiar words of the Third Glorious Mystery — the descent of Holy Spirit.

When the buses arrived, four of us decided to visit our senator together. As we got closer to her office, I told the group I had no idea what I was going to say, but I was depending on the Holy Spirit to provide the words. Others seemed to feel the same.

The group of four quickly turned into about 20 as others meandered by. We waited several minutes before being invited in, briefly. To my delight, the shaky voice I had earlier was now calm and clear as I expressed my concerns. Others were also empowered to speak what was on

their minds. I think we all left that room feeling glad that we had spoken what was on our hearts and had been heard. The senator, although pro-choice, agreed to look more closely at the bills and referred to something in the literature we had just handed her, which piqued her inter-

The visit to our representative's office was even briefer. She was unavailable because the House was in session. However, her aide assured us she was pro-life and would not be supporting the bills. At the end of the day I was glad I had gotten out of my comfort zone. What initially seemed daunting turned out to be a valuable lesson in trust.

Abortion has been legal in the United States since 1973, but, sadly, there's still too much silence about it. Perhaps some have taken the stance of my father and chosen to remain silent for fear of scandalizing the young. Or maybe they're silent for fear of wounding the post-abortive. Ultimately, speaking up is an opportunity to speak of the healing power of God's love and mercy and the ministries offered by the Church. Perhaps, it's just a matter of relying more on the Spirit for those times when words are difficult.
