- Western DuPage Special Recreation Area—\$1000
- Diocese of Joliet Life Office—\$25



#### **New 4th Degree Uniform**

Most of you know that there is a new official uniform for the 4th Degree. The regular regalia with chapeau and sword, social baldric and tux is no longer permitted as part of any honor guard. What can we wear at our honor guards?

- At all wakes: Honor Guards may consist of Full uniform, or Knights with yellow ceremonial sashes with a suit.
- In the Church: Honor Guards may consist of Full uniform, Knights with the yellow ceremonial sashes with a suit may partake in the procession. These Knights will appear behind the honor guard leaving a gap. Knights with ceremonial sash cannot stand in the aisle with the uniformed Knights. They must enter the pews before the clergy processes past them.
- In the Parades: Full uniform, Knights with yellow ceremonial sashes with a suit, or KofC shirts with long or short pants Each parade group is to be separated by some space. Parades have the most options.

The ceremonial sashes may be ordered from the English Company and run about \$29 each and can be ordered by length at <a href="https://www.kofcsupplies.com/item.c2">www.kofcsupplies.com/item.c2</a>.

#### Knights Cook for Cupertino Home Aug. 21


