March For Life Pilgrimage Account

"I bless God, One and Triune, for allowing me to go on a pilgrimage to Washington, DC, to participate in the March for Life and for giving me so many details of live that invited me to reflect on what it means to live, love, respect and defend life.

The first was to start the trip with young people who were enthusiastic, willing to sacrifice, full of life and zeal to defend it, especially in those who are weakest and helpless. They made me think of a generous and radical dedication of a heart in love with Love, in someone who bet on life until the end, as was the case with Sister Yadira (a sister of our religious community who died on January 20, 2020), who, however, suffering

from a very painful disease and being hopelessly ill, lived her life with dignity until the very last moment that God allowed her, for love and for defense and respect for the dignity of children.

Also, when listening during the opening homily in the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception, there was a quote from St John Paul II's Encyclical, "The Gospel of Life": "When conscience, this bright lamp of the soul (cf. Matthew 6:22-23), calls 'evil good and good evil' (Isaiah 5:20), it is already on the path to the most alarming corruption and the darkest moral blindness".

I thought of the current darkness of the state of Illinois that came to declare that abortion is "the fundamental right of a woman". This reality demands and calls me to authentically fulfill the Lord's mandate to be the light of the world (cf. Matthew 5:14-15), for darkness only duds appears with light.

During the March for Life and within the "river of people", composed of the sum of each "drop" - that is to say, of each person - to be able to contemplate the diversity of cultures, ages, languages, creeds, which were made one within the plurality of people to proclaim and

Statement from Most Reverend Richard Pates (3/19/2020): "Because of the rapid spread of the virus and in accord with the actions taken by the neighboring dioceses, all Church services, beginning with weekend Masses, daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, etc., in the parishes and institutions in the Diocese of Joliet will discon-

tinue immediately. This will remain in effect until it is prudently advisable to resume them...The ceremonies of Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday Celebration on April 4th through Easter are canceled in the parishes and institutions of the Diocese of Joliet. This radical step is most painful but is undertaken in the interests of the health of our parishioners and the broader community. I know it was ever so difficult for the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to take this same step at the Vatican."



Statement from Supreme Knight Carl Anderson (3/11/2020): "The Knights of Columbus is carefully monitoring the coronavirus situation and its impact on the Order. Since the virus is spread by personal contact, containment efforts stress social distancing by restricting travel, meetings and other gather-

ings. Accordingly, the Supreme Council most strongly recommends the following actions to protect brother Knights and others:

- Cancel all personal contact meetings, including business meetings, until further notice.
- Cancel all planned events, where people would gather, until further notice.
- Cancel all travel for Knights of Columbus business until further notice.

There are many ways to continue council operations without face to face contact. Here are some suggestions:

- Conduct meetings by conference call, Skype, Google Groups or other methods.
- Use a webinar service for large meetings like monthly business meetings.
- Allow member votes by email or text to approve bills and candidate admissions.
- Use the email feature of Officers Online for member communications.
- Set up a call tree to contact members and ascertain their wellbeing.
- Conduct degree ceremonies in homes using the combined Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity video or the First Degree video.
- Use applications like "Go fund me" to digitally raise funds for causes.

Additional information is available for members and their families on the websites of the CENTER FOR DISEASE CONTROL and WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION. Be aware that the elderly and sick are highly vulnerable to this disease.

This is a moment to deepen our commitment to the very principles which define us: charity, unity and fraternity. There will likely be many opportunities in coming weeks to live out these principles in service to our brother Knights, our families and our communities. May this time of difficulty also be a moment when we as Knights step into the breach and show ourselves to be disciples of Jesus Christ and men at the service of others."
