Council Knights to Conduct Virtual Tootsie Roll Drive

As a result of the global coronavirus pandemic, our Council has opted to conduct a virtual Tootsie Roll Drive this year in lieu of street corner solicitations. Since the founding of Council #6710 at St. Irene's in 1975, we have never missed a year in helping to support a variety of organizations that assist the mentally disabled. Except for the cost

of the candy, 100% of the money raised aids these charities.

Typically, we collect donations annually on the third week of September. However, due to the pandemic, this year we are going to try something a little different. Our Council is pursuing the idea of establishing a Go-FundMe page in an effort to realize our goals to continue support of the mentally disabled. In these tough financial times, the funds are needed now more than ever.

Through our drive, we support the Special Olympics which was the original recipient of the funds when first established in 1970 by the Knights of

Knights of Columbus Remains Firm in its Namesake Supreme Knight Carl Anderson

"Brother Knights:

We are all aware of the troubling events that are occurring today, including attacks on statues of historical figures such as Abraham Lincoln, Frederick Douglass and our Order's namesake, Christopher Columbus. Statues of saints have also been vandalized, including those honoring St. Junípero Serra, St. Louis and even the Blessed Virgin Mary, and houses of worship and other religious symbols have been attacked. These are not merely attacks on statues and history. They are increasingly attacks on Catholics and people of faith.

In the late 19th century, the Knights of Columbus took its name at a time of intense anti-Catholicism. Our founding members wanted to show that Catholics played an essential role in the exploration and development of America since its earliest days, and that a Catholic could be both a good citizen and a good Catholic.

However, anti-Catholicism persisted. In the 1920s, the Ku Klux Klan tried to stop Columbus Day celebrations and opposed Columbus statues simply because Columbus was a Catholic. We opposed the KKK then and have continued to stand up against bigotry directed at Catholics and others.

Ben is a very visible and active young man. ProLife Natural (and Supernatural) Family Planning

"My wife, Marguerite, and I



practice natural family planning. We also have eight children. Some would conclude from these facts that that NFP "doesn't work." On the contrary, we would respond: NFP works better than we could have ever imagined. It has brought extraordinary blessings to our marriage.

In my high school home economics class, in addition to teaching us how to balance a checkbook, iron a shirt and cook a simple meal, offered lessons on artificial birth control. The basic premise was that pregnancy alters one's life and that becoming pregnant was a snap - unless, of course, intrusive precautions were taken. As it turns out, the class premise was only half right: Pregnancy and birth are life-changing; but becoming pregnant — and staying pregnant — is often no easy feat.

When Marguerite and I were first married, I thought it prudent to take a little time, start jobs, make some money and get used to our common life. But God thought otherwise, and snap! — we found ourselves pregnant within the first year. And what a joy it was! Married life was already a blessing, and the expectation of our first baby lifted our happiness even higher. However, our high spirits crashed when we lost this first baby to miscarriage. This loss was followed by the stillborn birth at 30 weeks of a daughter, Louise. We tried to conceive again, but to no avail. It turned out that pregnancy was no easy matter.

And that's where NFP comes into our story. NFP helped to diagnose infertility issues and address them safely, naturally and morally. Dr. Louise Smyth, a physician trained in NaPro Technology (natural procreative technology), through the Paul VI Institute in Omaha, Neb., came to our aid. After teaching us to read fertility signs and chart cycles, the problem emerged more clearly. My wife had a progesterone deficiency, and Dr. Smyth prescribed supplementary progesterone injections to help carry the next pregnancy to full term.

There was a second physician who also came to our aid: St. Gianna Beretta Molla. Canonized by Pope John (Continued on page 5)

Special Camps.. What A Year! Thank you for your continued support. With Covid-19, this has been quite a year. A 26th year of Special Camps memories never to be forgotten... and hopefully not be to be repeated.

We were the first of many camps in Illinois to cancel camp, due to safety concerns for our amazing campers with intellectual, physical and medical concerns. There was just no way of assuring everyone's safety. This extremely challenging and tearful decision was made mid-March.

About the same time, we became acutely aware of our campers and their families growing challenges. Group homes suddenly closing with parents told to either take their child home until Covid-19 ends, or leave them there with no family visits until the virus ended. School, therapy, workshops, jobs, recreation, everything they depended upon suddenly shut down. A few contracted Covid-19 ... all recovered. We knew we could not cancel Special Camps without somehow replacing it. The increased isolation becoming unbearable, and so very isolating.

Special Camps Zoom (online) and weekly Facebook challenges were created in March to end the isolation. Our initial Zoom dance parties held in early April led way to craft parties, game nights and more dance parties. We are now hosting Special Camps Zoom every evening of camp. We have had campfire sing alongs, Disney Trivia night, Top Secret Camper Meetings where we play a prank on the Volunteers, Talent Shows, Ice Bucket Challenges (brrr..), and more dance parties. Though I dearly miss living side by side with our campers and my morning hugs, Zoom camp is wildly fun and successful with as many as 86 guests Zooming with us at once.

Paul II in 2004, Molla was an Italian pediatrician who, while pregnant with a baby girl, was diagnosed with a fibroid tumor on her uterus. Rather than risk her unborn child's life, Molla declined radical treatment. She died April 28, 1962, just one week after giving birth. We asked her intercession daily, and we are grateful today to both Dr. Gianna and Dr. Louise for our "Gianna babies."

Contrary to the popular mindset, the "P" in NFP is for "planning" not "prevention" — though NFP can also help a couple avoid pregnancy should they need to in grave situations. In our marriage, NFP has been an essential means to grow and sustain the love between my wife and me and for our children. I don't think I would be a father, or at least not the father I am, without it.

But there's a familiar saying that is also relevant here: "If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans!" This is also my NFP experience. After marriage, I planned to wait some time before pregnancy and planned for all things to go smoothly. This didn't happen. Thankfully, a better Father than I had his own plan. It included not only NFP, but joy and sorrow, anxiety and relief, disappointment and gratitude - as well as doctors and saints. It's a plan my wife and I could never have imagined, let alone executed on our own."

The monks that will oversee my education have devoted their lives to the church. Due to this, I feel confident in their ability to always lead my in the right direction and help me to understand what God's plan is for me. Knowing they will be there to guide me already allows me to feel comfort in the direction I'm going.

I know the catholic high school that I will be attending this coming fall is the best fit for me because the very first time I went there I felt like I belonged. I could feel the strong sense of community and service that was surrounding me and knew that that was the correct path for me. This community is like no other. Their dedication to serve is inspiring to me and I look forward to serving the church by serving my community.
