Feb. 7, 2021—Virtual KC **Super Bowl** Raffle & Party

You are invited to participate in the 25th Annual Knights of Columbus Super Bowl Raffle to be on Feb. 7, 2021 during the Super Bowl game. The Raffle is a major fundraiser for the St. Irene Knights of Columbus Council. It is a 50-50 cash raffle with half of the proceeds awarded to participants, and the other half retained by the local Council to be used for programs that benefit the St. Irene's Parish, Grade School, and community outreach programs.

The raffle and the ticket sales will be conducted virtually due to COVID-19 pandemic restrictions. Multi-media will be used to communicate event happenings including the church bulletin, email, St. Irene Knights of Columbus web site and Facebook page.

As in previous years, the raffle is based on purchasing squares in three separate football pools. For the Faith and Hope Pools the tickets are \$25 per square, and for the Charity pool the tickets are \$50 ticket per square. Buy your raffle tickets early to take advantage of two early drawings. Early Bird drawings that cover the cost of a ticket will be


held on Jan. 24 and 31. Early bird raffle winners remain


Intellectual Disability Drive Fund Distribution Announced

St. Irene Knights of Columbus Super Bowl Raffle Feb. 7, 2021

Early-Bird Drawings: Drawings will be held virtually Jan. 24 & 31 at St. Irene's. Each entry can only win once during the early-bird drawings, but remains eligible for the drawings on Super Bowl Sunday, Feb. 7, 2021.

Raffle on Super Bowl Sunday: Prior to the start of the football game, for each respective pool 100 number pairs will be randomly assigned to each raffle ticket holder, from (0,0) through (9,9). During the football game, one cash prize will be awarded to the person holding the winning number pair each time a team scores; a touchdown plus points after constitutes one score. The winning number pair is comprised as follows: the least significant digit (right most digit) in the NFC team score constitutes the first number, and the least significant digit of the AFC team constitutes the second number in the pair. The cash prize amount is determined by a random drawing from the available cash prize pool. The remainder, if any, at the game's end will be awarded by random drawing of those raffle tickets not having a winning combination during the football game.

The pool of 17 cash prizes are based on 100 tickets sold for each pool. The number of cash prizes and the total cash amount awarded may be reduced to maintain the same winning odds (0.17) and 50% payout of ticket receipts. In the event of multiple raffles being conducted, cash prizes may be pooled. Fifty percent of the raffle ticket receipts will be used to support St. Irene Knights of Columbus programs.


