In-Person Drive September 17-19—Obtaining the permit from the City of Warrenville for an in-person on the street ID is in process, albeit delayed because of COVID restrictions uncertainties. The anticipation is that the Knights will again be able to solicit donations on the street

corners in Warrenville. Street collections will take place September 17-19.

Virtual GoFundeMe Drive September-October—The Council will also set-up a GoFundMe page in order to add to our goal. The success of the virtual drive in 2020 has prompted us to do the same this year. The virtual drive is targeted to be conducted within the Warrenville Community during the months of September and October.

History—Through our drive, we support the Special Olympics which was the original recipient of the funds when first established in 1970 by the Knights of Columbus in Tinley Park, Illinois. Since that time, the drive has grown substantially. The drive is now conducted across 44 states. Our Council also helps to financially assist Cupertino Home (a Clarewoods Academy group home on Warren Ave., Warrenville), Special Camps for Special Citizens, Western DuPage Special Recreation District, and Illinois Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc.

Aug. 28-29 & Sept. 4-5—Bread Tag Collection Drive

The St. Irene Knights of Columbus is partnering with SCARCE, a local environmental education group, to collect bread tags for the "Danielle Cares for Chairs" charity. Started by a 17-year-old high schooler, this non-profit collects and recycles bread tags to acquire wheelchairs and mobility assistance devices for those in need. our founder, **Fr. Michael McGivney**. With birthdays come change, we get older and...some of us get more mature. I can think of a few people who didn't. But...getting older also leads to loss eventually. Before I go into my spiel, I'm gonna be real for a second. I was gonna talk about what it means to be a knight this month, but something else happened, so, assuming I'm still doing these in a year, I'll do that next year.

This year, I'm going to deal with loss. And I'll probably cry while writing this. Anyways, here we go. As many of you know, I was in Boy Scouts for 5 years, from when I was 12 until I aged out at 18. I'm betting that they're probably going to cut down the remaining few aspens. I worked there one year, and it still hit me hard. I can't even imagine how hard it hit those who worked there for years. Someone worked there for 8 years, I can't imagine how he felt. Sure, there was a lot of laughter and we all still have the memories, but just knowing that it'll close...that hurt.

There is a song about the place, but the whole song would take up too much space, so I'm just going to write the chorus. "But when I left there a part of me stayed for me to return once more, scattered in the leaves of the aspen trees and sown in the sandy soil." I broke down during this song, and I'm not scared to admit it. It's a change, it's a loss, but if last year and this year have taught me anything, it's how to handle loss. I've lost people who were very near and dear to me, and now I'm losing a place that holds a special part of my heart and always will. It's a loss, but we must move on.


