Feb. 13, 2022—Virtual KC Super Bowl Raffle & Party

As in previous years for the raffle, \$25 tickets are being sold for two separate pools (Faith and Hope) of 100 tickets each. A \$50 ticket may be purchased for the Charity Pool. Prizes for the \$25 pools are 2-\$250, 2-\$125, 6-\$50, and 7-\$25 cash. Cash prize amounts for the \$50 ticket are doubled.

ProLife Roe v Wade—Supreme Court Watch

The Mississippi Attorney General along with other states' officials filed a Supreme Court Brief on October 13, 2021. Oral arguments in the case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization are scheduled for December 1, 2021. This could mean that the Supreme Court may re-examine its rulings on legalized nationwide abortion, which could lead to the repeal of Roe v. Wade.

While Dobbs already had drawn interest as the first abortion-related case following the death of Ruth Bader Ginsburg and appointment of Amy Coney Barrett in her place, placing six conservative justices on the bench, the case drew even more attention following the enactment of the <u>Texas Heartbeat Act</u> on September 1, 2021 along with the Supreme Court's denial to move to block enforcement of the law while it was undergoing a legal challenge via <u>Whole Woman's Health v. Jackson</u> and <u>United States v. Texas</u>.

The Texas Heartbeat Act made abortions after the sign of fetal heartbeat - typically six weeks after pregnancy - illegal, but as to work around Roe v. Wade, the law is not enforced by the state but gives any citizen the right to sue anyone that assists or enables those that perform these pregnancies in state courts. Oral arguments for both cases were made on November 1, 2021, where observers of the Supreme Court said that the Court was focused on the aspects of standing rather than addressing the abortion issue directly. [14] The Texas law is highly controversial, and as a result, numerous additional briefs were filed to Dobbs most supporting the abortion clinics' position. Over 1,125 friend-of-the-court briefs had been filed in Dobbs by mid-September 2021. [15]

Separately, Georgia had passed <u>House Bill 481</u> in 2019, which banned abortions after six weeks. The law was challenged and deemed unconstitutional under Roe v. Wade in October 2019 by the <u>United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia</u>. The state challenged this ruling to the <u>Eleventh Circuit</u>, but due to Dobbs being scheduled for December 2021, the Circuit Court issued a stay of review until after the Supreme Court had decided Dobbs.[16]

Early-Bird Drawings: Drawings will be held virtually Jan. 30 & Feb. 6. Each entry can only win once during the early-bird drawings, but remains eligible for the drawings on Super Bowl Sunday, Feb. 13, 2022.

Raffle on Super Bowl Sunday: Prior to the start of the football game, for each respective pool 100 number pairs will be randomly assigned to each raffle ticket holder, from (0,0) through (9,9). During the football game, one cash prize will be awarded to the person holding the winning number pair each time a team scores; a touchdown plus points after constitutes one score. The winning number pair is comprised as follows: the least significant digit (right most digit) in the NFC team score constitutes the first number, and the least significant digit of the AFC team constitutes the second number in the pair. The cash prize amount is determined by a random drawing from the available cash prize pool. The remainder, if any, at the game's end will be awarded by random drawing of those raffle tickets not having a winning combination during the football game.

The pool of 17 cash prizes are based on 100 tickets sold for each pool. The number of cash prizes and the total cash amount awarded may be reduced to maintain the same winning odds (0.17) and 50% payout of ticket receipts. In the event of multiple raffles being conducted, cash prizes may be pooled. Fifty percent of the raffle ticket receipts will be used to support St. Irene Knights of Columbus programs.


