A young woman was on her way into Planned Parenthood for her scheduled abortion. The sidewalk counselor reached out to her as she was crossing the parking lot and asked if she would like to talk. The young woman walked over and told the sidewalk counselor that she wanted to have her baby, but she did not want the baby to be associated with the father

The sidewalk counselor explained that she did not have to put the father's name on the birth certificate. The young woman was relieved when she heard this information and became more receptive to receiving help to keep her baby. The sidewalk counselor reminded the young woman that there was free help across the street at Waterleaf Women's clinic. One of Waterleaf's RNs was the 40 Days for Life Day Captain at the time and took the young woman to get the help she needed. Praise God!


