Council Knights to Conduct the Intellectual Disabilities "Tootsie Roll" Fund Drive September-October—Goal is \$7500

People with Intellectual Disabilities (ID) have limitations in intellectual functions like communicating, taking care of themselves, and impaired social skills. Depending on the level of impairment, many with ID live in special facilities

and group homes. Although they are state-supported, funding is limited. Annually, the Knights of Columbus conduct a fund drive to help support organizations that offer service to people with ID.

- Illinois State Council: A second Council online page is provided by the Illinois Knights of Columbus. Follow this <u>Illinois State Council</u> <u>link</u>. We were requested to participate in the Illinois State Council fund drive as well.
- For both online fund drives, a 3% transaction fee is assessed.

The St. Irene Knights of Columbus in Warrenville, Illinois ID Fund drive will be conducted September through October, 2022. Half the money raised will be donated to the Cupertino Group Home in Warrenville (a <u>Clare Woods Academy</u> operated facility, Carol Stream). The remaining half will be split between <u>Western DuPage Special Recreation Association</u>, <u>Special Camps for Special People</u> of Winfield, and <u>Illinois Knights of Columbus Charities</u>. All 100% of the funds we receive from this GoFundMe drive support these organizations.

The St. Irene Knights of Columbus has conducted this fund drive every year since its founding in 1975. Before 2020, we exclusively conducted a street solicitation by selling Tootsie Rolls. Unfortunately, it was suspended in 2020 due to the COVID pandemic. Knights will again conduct a street solicitation this year from Sept. 16-18, but in a limited basis. We urge you to also support this effort by donating generously. Except for the candy cost, 100% of the money raised is donated to the designated organizations.

The Knights of Columbus and Special Camps Halloween party was a resounding success last year according to the very appreciative special needs community and the volunteers who attended. Hoping with your support, we can repeat this experience again this Fall. Due to COVID, the outdoors Halloween event will replace the indoor Christmas party. Last year due to COVID, none of the group homes were able to participate. This year, hopefully they will be a larger portion of our party. The estimated number of people in attendance is150, with 100 special needs guests. I'll have a more exact number two weeks before the party begins.

Activities to Include: Trunk Or Treating (trick or treating by decorated trunks of cars), games, painting mini pumpkins, handicap accessible hayride, Bingo, face painting, costume contest, games, picnic for families (giving them opportunity to socialize with other families similar to themselves). New this year, King Cobras Drumline will play drumline music while providing drum lessons with slightly muted drums and headphones. It was a huge hit at camp!

Last year the Knights were amazing! So, I am hoping we can do the same this year. If you've got access to donations or wish to change the responsibilities around, or have a great activity idea you feel our special needs guests would love. Please let the group know. Thanks!

- St. John's Knights: Provide / Grill a combo of cheeseburgers and hotdogs, buns + condiments. Families who would have special dietary needs will be encouraged to bring their own picnic. Food to be served about 4:30 5 pm.
- St. Irene's Warrenville: Provide a wheelchair accessible hayride. I was amazed at how easily those with wheelchairs (most were able to walk), were able to get on and off of the hayride. Also an assortment of desserts like individual bags of chips, Halloween cookies, cupcakes, pie and volunteers to run the hayride and serve those special treats. One or two packages of sugar-free puddings always seem to be appreciated as well.
- St Mary's West Chicago: Drinks for 150 of us. My thoughts, about half should be bottled water. Heavy quality (sturdy), paper plates (for burgers and small ones for desserts), heavy duty forks, spoons for desserts, napkins.
- Corpus Christi Knights of Carol Stream have been asked to again provide 100 mini pumpkins and \$100 for bingo gifts.

Responsibilities While At The Party:

- St. John's: Cook and serve burgers. Please double check bathrooms for safety (about every 20 30 minutes).
- St. Irene's: Run the hayride and parking lot safety, serve desserts and drinks at meal time.
- St Mary's: Help with serving food, walk around securing safety, assisting anyone who needs help, and clean up during / after the party.
- Corpus Christi: Run bingo, and assist with games.

- Help needed at 1:30 PM with set up.
- Please try to provide at least 5 or 6 volunteers (adult or teen) to arrive by 2;30 PM for a short prayer and instructions.
- If anyone has Halloween decorations to share that would be great!
- Anyone able to serve as our photographer? Need about 10 good photos showing a wide array of activities.
- Others volunteering will be asked to help with a specific activity helping guests decorate pumpkins, check guests in and give them with a name badge and candy bag, hand out candy at one of the decorated cars or run games.
- Costumes are optional. No scary costumes allowed. Please try to wear a funny hat, shirt, or costume to make the party more festive.
