KC Membership Drive Feb. 25-26

On the weekend of Feb. 25-26, our Council will be conducting a membership drive at St. Irene's. At each Mass, a pulpit announcement inviting Catholic men to join the Knights of Columbus will be made. The announcement will describe who we are and what we do. Those who are interested along with their families will be invited to the Activities Center immediately after the Mass for a

short presentation (< 30 min) by representatives of our Council and Insurance agent, explaining the benefits of membership. Download Member Benefits publication to read more about the benefits offered.

Prospects will be urged to join electronically. The QR code above with the KC insignia at its center can be used. Use your cell phone to scan the code and select the web address shown. The web page requests your name, contact information, parish name, and Council number: 6710. There is no membership charge for the first year.

Financial Secretary James Halama will receive a notice, and will contact the new e-member and arrange to formally induct him into our Council. A degree ceremony video will be presented, and at the end of the video, emember(s) will become 3rd Degree members of the Knights of Columbus. E-members are urged to have their family members present during the degree ceremony and video presentation.

The membership drive does not need to be restricted to those attending Mass on this designated weekend. Prior to this weekend, You (KC member, ladies, or anyone reading this article) can try to recruit prospects. Invite them to attend one of the presentations on Feb. 25 or Feb. 26 the St. Irene Activities Center. Actually, all that is needed is to invite the prospect to join electronically by scanning the QR code above.



ProLife Knights Join 50th Annual March for Life Knight Line, Jan. 24, 2023

Hard copies of the ticket order form will be made available separately by Council members. You may also contact **PGK James Halama** at jrhalama@comcast.net or at 630-433-6240.

As in previous years, the raffle is based on purchasing squares in three separate football pools. For the Faith and Hope Pools the tickets are \$25 per square, and for the Charity pool the tickets are \$50 ticket per square. The squares and numbers for each ticket are assigned randomly. Multiple cash prizes ranging from \$25 to \$500 will be awarded throughout the Super Bowl game.



Early-Bird Drawings: Drawings will be held Jan. 29 & Feb. 5. Each entry can only win once during the early-bird drawings, but remains eligible for the drawings on Super Bowl Sunday, Feb. 12, 2023.

Raffle on Super Bowl Sunday: Prior to the start of the football game, for each respective pool 100 number pairs will be randomly assigned to each raffle ticket holder, from (0,0) through (9,9). During the football game, one cash prize will be awarded to the person holding the winning number pair each time a team scores; a touchdown plus points after constitutes one score. The winning number pair is comprised as follows: the least significant digit (right most digit) in the NFC team score constitutes the first number, and the least significant digit of the AFC team constitutes the second number in the pair. The cash prize amount is determined by a random drawing from the available cash prize pool. The remainder, if any, at the game's end will be awarded by random drawing of those raffle tickets not having a winning combination during the football game.

The pool of 17 cash prizes are based on 100 tickets sold for each pool. The number of cash prizes and the total cash amount awarded may be reduced to maintain the same winning odds (0.17) and 50% payout of ticket receipts. In the event of multiple raffles being conducted, cash prizes may be pooled. Fifty percent of the raffle ticket receipts will be used to support St. Irene Knights of Columbus programs.
