There's been a lot of news about major meetings lately. Political conventions, the Olympics, etc., have taken over the television, radio, social media and more. But one large meeting took place in Indianapolis this past July that we should all pay attention to: the National Eucharistic Congress.

Held over four days in Indianapolis, the Eucharistic Congress was the culmination of several pilgrimages that progressed to Indianapolis from all over the country. Once there, pilgrims took part in events to deepen our faith and our limited understanding of the miracle of the Eucharist.

One of the takeaways from the Eucharistic Congress was the call to "Walk with One" – an "opportunity to be God's instrument in the life of another person." This means we're called to pray an "examen" (a structured prayer with scripture passages) that helps us discover how to be the channel that reaches out to someone to help them on their faith journey. ProLife End of Life Issues

The Catholic Church honors the dignity of human life from concep-

tion to natural death. While there is much publicized about abortion and the life of the baby, it seems that there is less communicated about end-of-life issues. One may be confused about what is considered dignity when suddenly faced with these issues. Oftentimes we turn to hospice to look for answers. Hospice care should neither artificially extend life nor hasten death.

Unfortunately, there are cases where family members believe their particular hospice care is trying to hasten death. According to Illinois Right to Life, "Some hospices and hospice organizations actively promote actions that hasten death including terminal sedation, withdrawal of nutrition and hydration, and delivery of pain relief that suppresses breathing hastening death. Certain hospices and hospice organizations have been found to facilitate assisted suicide."

Illinois Right to Life has developed 25 questions you can ask to determine what type of care philosophy a hospice follows. The checklist can be used to help determine whether a specific hospice is the right place for you or your loved one in an effort to preserve the dignity of life even until death. July 4th Food Concession Nets \$3871

Thanks to our Food Concession Chair PGK Erich Pavel and his committee of Justin Wagner, Bill Lintner, PGK Jim Halama,

and GK Marc Alleruzzo to a very successful event again this year.

Total revenue was \$6347, expenses \$2476, with net \$3871. This was one of the best years that we have had in a long time. Last year, we made just over \$2650.

Our expenses were substantially less than years past, we eliminated soda and did not buy a barrel of beer, (used cases of beer - much more economical). The cost for a case of corn was \$15. Llast year we paid over \$35 for a case of corn. We went through 780 hamburgers (26 cases), 800 ears of corn (16 crates) and 320 hot dogs (4 boxes). We moved a lot of food. Thanks for the many volunteers who made this possible, without your help we would not have done it.


