ProLife

Too often, our national conversation on marriage, adoption, and IVF focuses entirely on the desires of adults – while com-

pletely ignoring the rights of children. But if we're serious about restoring a moral foundation in this country, we must flip that script.

Recently on At the Core, I spoke with Katy Faust, founder of Them Before Us, about what happens when society – and policy – fail to prioritize children's wellbeing. The truth is sobering: Kids need a married mom and dad, preferably biological. Social science confirms it. Scripture affirms it. Yet current cultural trends and public policy treat that truth as optional. Whether it's commercial surrogacy, no-fault divorce, or the reckless expansion of IVF, too many decisions are being made without considering what's best for the most vulnerable among us.

Katy reminds us that adoption should never be about adults getting what they want. It should be a response to tragedy – a way to restore what a child has lost, not to institutionalize that loss from the start. And IVF? An estimated 97% of embryos created are never born. Most are either discarded, indefinitely frozen, destroyed in failed implantation, or used for research. That's not pro-life; it's a silent tragedy hiding in plain sight.

The path forward is simple, but not easy: We must put children first. That single shift reframes everything. As Katy said, "Looking at everything through the lens of 'what if we put children first?' solves all of these problems"

It's time to refocus our attention on truth and begin protecting children.

Chairmen Needed to Conduct Council Outreach Programs

We, our Council, is looking for members who are wanting have more active participation in Council programs. Please contact **GK Pat McGowan** of your interest. These programs were designed by **Joe Kubal** and he has provided a detailed manual for each program for someone to follow. The programs that need attention and direction are:

- Feed the Need Food Packing Event—The program is typically held each March at Benedictine University, Naperville. The Food Packing event is sponsored Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) and provides food for needy children internationally.
- Feed My Starving Children Food Packing Event—The event is typically held each November. The purpose is helping to feed children internationally and at home by packing food at at the Aurora facility located at 555 Exchange Avenue although there are other centers available.
- March for Kids Donation Drive—The program is typically held each March. The purpose is to support the Mission of Mercy Home for Boys and Girls in providing a haven for abused youth. Donations are solicited at St. Irene Church during a weekend of Masses.
- Bread Tag/Key/Poptop Tabs—This is a semiannual Collection Drive typically held in February and July each year—The drive is in support of Danielle Cares for Chairs who provides wheelchairs to the needy through bread tags, SCARCE, a local environmental resource center through keys and works in collaboration with Danielle Cares for Chairs, and Ronald McDonald House through pop-top tabs. Collection receptacles are placed in the church.
- **KofC/Lions Club Annual Eyeglass Drive**—This drive is an annual drive typically held in May. The purpose is to support visually impaired individuals through a joint endeavor between the Knights and Lions Club International. Collection receptacles are placed in church during the period of the drive.
- Share Your Soles Shoe Collection Drive—The drive is annual held each October and into November. The is to collect shoes in support of Share Your Soles Foundation who provides gently worn shoes to the needy both locally and internationally. Collection vessels are placed in the church during the period of the drive. There is also an ongoing drive at two locations in Warrenville outside of the parish.
- Knight's Men's Night Out—This a social event held annually in May held at a local restaurant. A requirement is to invite our Paster.

Her submitted essay on "Why you feel a Catholic education will benefit you" is as follows:


